New Pick for Head of U.S. Department of Labor

On 2/15/17, facing criticism from both sides of the aisle, fast-food executive Andrew Pudzer withdrew his nomination to head the Labor Department. The next day, President Trump announced his intent to nominate Alexander Acosta for the position. Acosta clerked for Justice Samuel Alito when Alito was a judge on the 3rd Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals. He also served on the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) under President George W. Bush from 2002 to 2003, then left the NLRB to become an assistant attorney general for the Justice Department's Civil Rights division between 2003 and 2005. He then served as U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Florida from 2005 to 2009, and currently holds the position of dean of the Florida International University College of Law.
